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## Milan Background and Contest

The south eastern suburbs territory is characterized by the presence of trade small companies, services for trade companies and services for industries and small family owned shops. Poor now, the industrial reality was prevalent some time ago. The school is part of a neighbourhood that in recent years has seen many changes both structurally and socially. The migratory flow, coming from various countries, was engaged in an environment already partly compromised by lawlessness and the socio-cultural disadvantage. Another additional factor may further complicate the relationship between multigenerational households and locations. Specifically, housing attainment in suburbia may shift down or be barred for minority households for economic or other reasons. Racial minorities opt to establish multigenerational households to share resources for the purpose of alleviating poverty and income inequality. After years of constant changes and new arrivals of foreign families from different countries, in the past 5 years there has been a more stable living situation, with the presence of groups coming only from South America and from the Maghreb countries.

Socio-economic fragility of many families is reflected in a lack of cultural tools to support teenagers. In almost all cases both parents also spend the afternoon at work, with an obvious effort to maintain an ongoing and productive dialogue with the school. Some aspects of the cultural contexts strengthen the school to ensure educational success for all students.

The Secondary School "Meda-Ferrarin" accommodates a total of 240 students divided into 13 classes with an average class size of 19 students.
